Class II D2 Malocclusion Case with Complete Deep Bite and Supplemental Tooth in the Lower Jaw

Clinical Presentation

Intra oral image of Sudanese girl 17 years old (Figures 1-5) with:

Typical Class II D2 malocclusion.

Complete deep bite.

In the upper jaw left side, 5 mm extra spaces distal to the permanent canine.

In the lower jaw right side, lingually erupted extra lateral incisor tooth which resemble the permanent one (Supplemental) with 90 degree rotation.
